Climate, Oceans, and Human Health: The Chesapeake Bay as a Paradigm for Predicting Infectious Diseases

Marine biology historically has been closely intertwined with human health. Today significant advances in technology have brought new discoveries - from the outer reaches of space, where remote sensing monitors on satellites circle the earth, to the ultramicroscopic through application of next-generation sequencing and bioinformatics. *Vibrio cholerae* provides a useful example of the fundamental link between human health and the oceans. With the onset of COVID-19, these models are currently being modified to predict SARS CoV-2 and incidence of COVID-19. In summary, microbial ecology can serve as a critical indicator of human health and wellness. How this is accomplished and how we are beginning to understand environmental aspects of COVID-19 will be discussed in this talk.
